

We have wanted a family since very early on and as a same-sex couple we have always known adoption would be our first choice in creating our family. 

Our families are very supportive and when your child arrives, Jeff's parents will come and help us care for them in the beginning. We are creating a nursery, within our newly owned art studio building, where your child can sleep and play close to us and we can spend time together throughout each day. We also employ seven studio assistants who are all very excited to meet the baby we are lucky enough to adopt. Our schedules are flexible and we plan to both be primary care givers on a daily basis.

Being an interracial couple ourselves, we are well prepared to raise a child of any race and look forward to meeting them and learning more about their heritage and yours as well. We believe that your child should know as much as they and you are comfortable with about each other. Your child will travel and see other cultures including theirs and ours (Norwegian and Native American). As they grow older, we know that children have many interests and that they will change. We are committed to supporting them in their interests as they figure out who they are. We will carefully consider day cares, nursery schools, and K-12 schools that will provide stimulation and education along with nurturing and support. We look forward getting to know your child and to support them as they make discoveries from childhood into adulthood.



We have worked hard to get to this point and are ready to welcome your baby into our home. We will provide the very best environment that we can to ensure that your child has an extremely happy childhood, knows they are loved, receives a good education, is healthy in mind and body, and is ultimately prepared to have a successful life as an adult. We will always be here for them and understand parenting does not end when they leave our home. We know that life is full of ups and downs and we will be here to support them through all of it and always with kindness and unconditional love.

We are open to maintaining communication with you before and after the adoption process is complete as we feel this is very beneficial to the physical and mental well-being of your child as they develop as a person. We will always speak of you in the highest regard.
