

Requirement for Proof of Negative COVID-19 Test or Recovery from COVID-19 for All Air Passengers Arriving in the United States

The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) within the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) issued an <u>order</u> on January 12, 2021 requiring proof of a negative COVID-19 test or documentation of having recovered from COVID-19 for all air passengers arriving from a foreign country to the United States.

The CDC is requiring all air passengers arriving to the United States from a foreign country to get tested no more than 3 days before their flight departs and to present the negative result or documentation of having recovered from COVID-19 to the airline before boarding the flight. Air passengers will also be required to confirm that the information they present is true in the form of an <u>attestation</u>.

This Order is effective as of 12:01am EST (5:01am GMT) on January 26, 2021.
